Leader: Beloved we have not done this as we ought; therefore, let us corporately confess our sin

Corporate Confession of sin:

Heavenly Father we call to mind that our old self was crucified with Christ so that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin-because anyone who has died has been freed from sin. We also recall that if we died with Christ, we will also live with him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. But even though all of that is true, we still sin. We still search out our own way. We still pursue life and the longings of our hearts as though we were God and were to receive all the glory. We confess our brokenness, our corruption, our remaining deadness, our incessant striving to have life our way. We are most grateful for Christ who has accomplished our redemption, forgiven our sin and given us new life. May that new life blossom and flourish for our good and your glory, through Christ our Risen & Reigning Lord, Amen
