Invocation

The Law of Christ: Phil 2:2-8

Pastor: The Apostle Paul summarized the moral law of God by saying,

Congregation: [M]ake my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death-- even death on a cross!

Pastor: Beloved we have not done this as we ought; therefore let us corporately confess our sin:

Corporate Confession of sin: (adapted from The Valley of Vision and Piercing Heaven)

O Lord God, We come to you now to seek your forgiveness. Lord we are broken, prone to wander. We find it hard to fight against this foe and these temptations; they cling so closely to us. Lord, we confess that we have not done what you command and have often done what you have forbidden. We have honored you with our words but we have failed to follow you with our lives. We have been tempted to hard-heartedness, pride, selfishness, and unbelief. Father let us not dishonor your name.

We plead that you arm us, by your Spirit, to reject the idols that the world, the devil, and our own flesh always lay in our path. Pardon our sins, known and unknown, felt and unfelt, remembered or forgotten; Help us to put these sins to death that we may freely enter into your kingdom, secured for us by your Son, Jesus Christ, his atoning death on the cross and resurrection which brings us to life.

Personal (silent)

Assurance of Pardon: Psalm 103:8-12

The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. He will not always chide, nor will he keep his anger forever. He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

Congregation: We give praise to God for although he was angry with us his anger has been turned away and by faith in Christ our sins are forgiven.

Pastor: How far has he separated your sins from you?

Congregation: As far as the East is from the West, and he has replaced them with the righteousness of Christ

All: Praise and glory be to God our Father and to his Son Jesus our only Savior!
