Invocation

The Law of Christ: Col 3:5-6

Pastor: The apostle Paul summarized the moral law of God by saying,

Congregation: Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming.

Pastor: Beloved we have not done this as we ought; therefore let us confess our sin:

Corporate Confession of sin:

Oh, Lord, our Holy God, as with David of old, we confess that when we keep silent about our sins our bodies waste away and your hand is heavy upon us. Therefore, we now openly confess that we have sinned against you. We have not held your name in the highest esteem, we have broken your laws, we have not represented Christ properly in the world, and we have not loved others as you have loved us. Beyond our deficient behavior we confess that we still bear the marks of Adam and his rebellion against you.

We thank you that there is Mercy in Christ and we plead his blood for ourselves to cover all our transgressions. We thank you for the gift of his righteousness, which is ours by faith and for the position of acceptance which is ours by adoption into your family. Strengthen our wills to resist temptation and thereby conform us by your Spirit to our dear Savior Jesus Christ through whose merit we pray. Amen

Assurance of Pardon: Ps 86:3-5

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I call to you all day long. Bring joy to your servant, for to you, O Lord, I lift up my soul. You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you.

Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand.

For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members.

Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?

Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

Cup: HIS ROBES FOR MINE,

His robes for mine: O wonderful exchange! Clothed in my sin, Christ suffered 'neath God's rage. Draped in His righteousness, I'm justified. In Christ I live, for in my place He died.

Refrain:

His robes for mine: what cause have I for dread? God's daunting Law Christ mastered in my stead. Faultless I stand with righteous works not mine, Saved by my Lord's vicarious death and life.

(Refrain)

His robes for mine: God's justice is appeased. Jesus is crushed, and thus the Father's pleased. Christ drank God's wrath on sin, then cried "Tis done!" Sin's wage is paid; propitiation won. (*Refrain*)

His robes for mine: such anguish none can know. Christ, God's beloved, condemned as though His foe. He, as though I, accursed and left alone; I, as though He, embraced and welcomed home! (*Refrain*)
