The Law of Christ:

1Peter 3:8-11

Pastor: The Apostle Peter summarized the moral law of God by saying, Congregation: Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. For, "Whoever would love life and see good days must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from deceitful speech. He must turn from evil and do good; he must seek peace and pursue it.

Pastor: Beloved we have not done this as we ought; therefore, let us confess our sin:

Corporate Confession of sin: New Beginning-Adapted from the Valley of Vision

Incomprehensible, Great, and Glorious God, I adore you and abase myself. My thoughts are not screened from your gaze. My secret sins blaze in the light of your countenance. Enable me to remember that blood which cleanses all sin, to believe in that grace which subdues all iniquities, to resign myself to that agency which can deliver me from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the sons of God. You have begun a good work in me and you alone can continue and complete it. Give me an increasing conviction of my tendency to err, and of my exposure to sin. Help me to feel more of the purifying, softening influence of your hand, its compassion, love, pity, and employ me as your instrument in blessing others. Give me to distinguish between the mere form of godliness and its power, between guile and truth, between hypocrisy and a religion that will bear the inspection of your eye. If I am not right, set me right, keep me right; and may I at last come to your house in peace. All this I ask through the glorious merits of Jesus Christ my Savior. Amen
