The Law of Christ: James 1:19-22

Pastor: The Apostle James summarized the moral law of God by saying,

Congregation: My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires. Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you. Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.

Pastor: Beloved we have not done this as we ought; therefore, let us confess our sin:

Corporate Confession of sin:

Gracious Lord and all Glorious God, we have been created in your image, for the purpose of reflecting your glory in the world. We have failed you. So often we are more interested in our own glory than yours. Take us to the cross to seek glory from its infamy; strip us of every pleasing pretense of righteousness by our own doings. O gracious redeemer, we have neglected you too long, and crucified you afresh by impenitence. We have put you to open shame. Forgive us and may we never lose sight of the cross and the redemption accomplished there by our blessed Savior. Unite us to him with inseparable bonds, that nothing may ever draw us back from you, our Lord and our God – by Christ's merits and for his sake. Amen

Personal (silent)

Assurance of Pardon: Leviticus 16:30 On that day, the priest shall make atonement for you, to cleanse you, that you may be clean from all your sins before the Lord.

Congregation: We give praise to God who has atoned for our sins and cleansed us from them all.

Pastor: How has He made atonement for you?

Congregation: He has placed our sins on the Lamb of God, who was slain for us. All: Praise and glory be to God the Father, Christ the Lamb, and the Holy Spirit.

Pastor: John 3:17-21

¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. ¹⁹ And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed. ²¹ But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God."

Congregation: We give thanks to you, Heavenly Father, for sending your Son into this world to be the Light to us. We pray that we will live according to that light and do things that are true, thereby and demonstrating that you are at work in us by your Holy Spirit.

Confession of Faith: Shorter Catechism in Modern English
