The Law of Christ: The Law of Christ:

Matt 22:37-39

Pastor: The Lord Jesus Christ summarized the moral law of God by saying,

**Congregation: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."**

Pastor: Beloved we have not done this as we ought; therefore, let us confess our sin:

Corporate Confession of sin: Adapted from The Broken Heart – The Valley of vision

**O, LORD, No day of my life has passed that has not proved me guilty in your sight. Prayers have been uttered from a prayerless heart; Praise has been often a praiseless sound. Blessed Jesus, let me find a hiding place in your appeasing wounds. Though my sins rise to heaven your merits soar above them; though my unrighteousness weighs me down to hell, your righteousness exalts me to your Father's throne. All things in me call for my rejection, all things in you plead for my acceptance. Keep me always clinging to your cross. Flood me, I beg you, every moment with descending grace. Through Christ our only Savior, Amen**

Personal (silent)

Col 2:13

And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our trespasses.

**Congregation: We give praise to God who has liberated us from our trespasses.**

Pastor: How has He freed you from your trespasses?

**Congregation: He has canceled the record of debt that stood against us, having crucified it in Christ at the cross (Col 2:14).**

All: **Praise and glory be to God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.**

Pastor: Rom 6:6-8

We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him.

**Congregation: O Lord, thank you that in your crucifixion we too died to sin. We thank you for freeing us from sin. Grant us your grace that we will live to your glory and grow in works that honor your name. Amen.**

Response:

Minister: It is good to praise the LORD and make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your love in the morning and your faithfulness at night. ( Ps 92:1 )

**Congregation: For you make me glad by your deeds, O LORD; I sing for joy at the works of your hands. How great are your works, O LORD, how profound your thoughts! (Ps 92:4-5)**

Confession of Faith: Westminster Shorter Catechism in Modern English

Q. 33. What is justification?

**Justification is an act of God's free grace<sup>[a]</sup> in which he pardons all our sins<sup>[b]</sup> and accepts us as righteous in his sight<sup>[c]</sup> for the sake of the righteousness of Christ alone, which is credited to us<sup>[d]</sup> and received by faith alone.<sup>[e]</sup>**

Q. 34. What is adoption?

**Adoption is an act of God's free grace<sup>[a]</sup> by which we are received into the number and have a right to all the privileges of the sons of God.<sup>[b]</sup>**

Q. 35. What is sanctification?

**Sanctification is the work of God's free grace<sup>[a]</sup> by which we are renewed throughout in the image of God<sup>[b]</sup> and are enabled more and more to die to sin and live to righteousness.<sup>[c]</sup>**
